Our Guest Speaker: Navendu Mishra, Labour Party NEC

Navendu is a member of Labour Party's National Executive Committee, the highest body of the party (Labour is the largest political party in Europe with over half a million members).

Previously, he has also worked on industrial campaigns for the largest trade union in the UK- Unison. He is based in Stockport and works as the Lead Organiser for Momentum (successor of the Jeremy Corbyn leadership campaign) focused on transforming Labour into a people powered movement. He was active in the youth structures of Labour (Young Labour) and Unite the union. In 2017, he was Labour's parliamentary candidate in Hazel Grove constituency in the snap general election.

Navendu is also the youngest ever member of the NEC, and the first Hindu member of the Labour National Executive Committee.

Toilets will be clearly signposted.

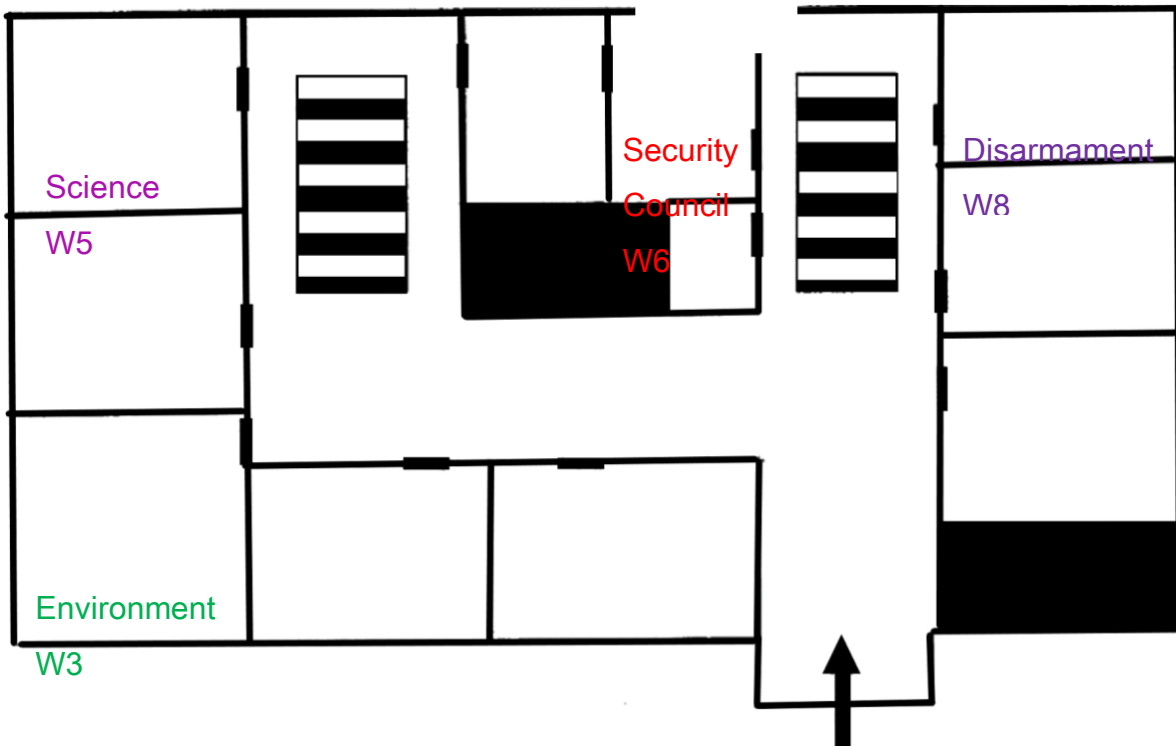
Fire arrangements will be read out in the opening ceremony.

Bribes are encouraged during the debate!

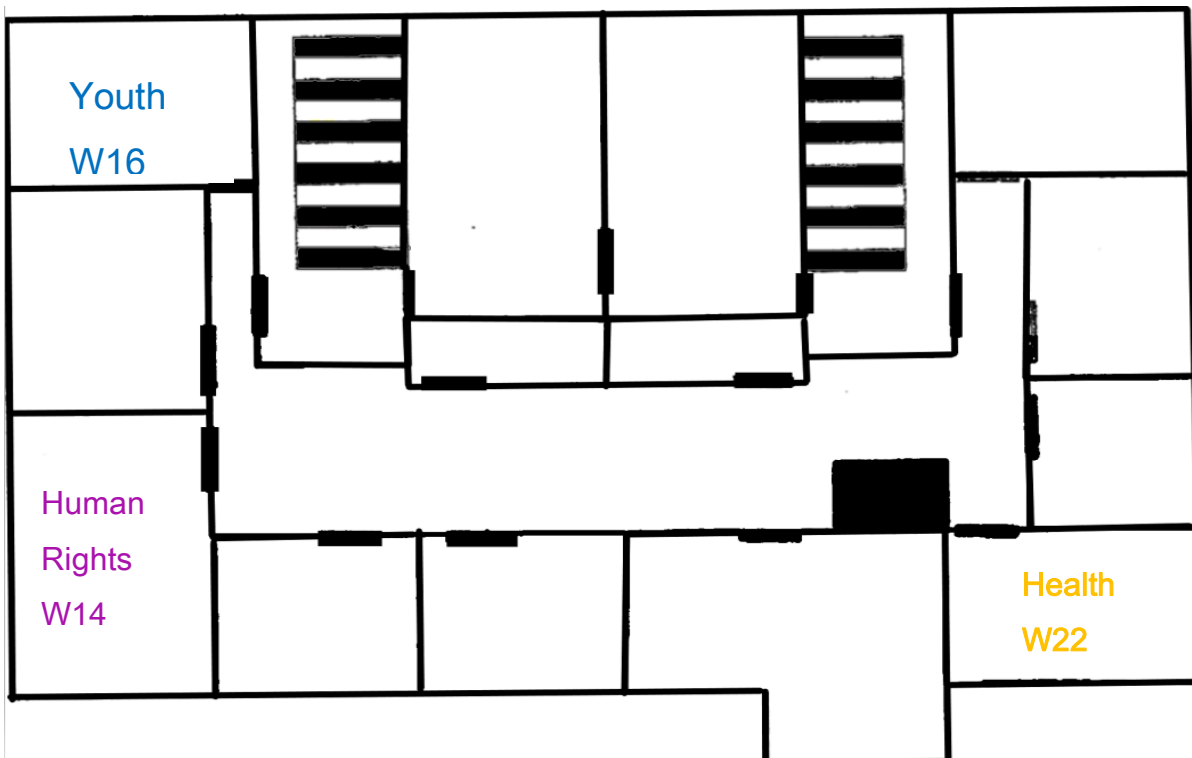
